

COUNTY EXECUTIVE GEORGE LATIMER TO OFFICIALLY REOPEN

County Executive George Latimer will officially welcome the public back to the historic Miller House in North White Plains with a ribbon-cutting ceremony on Monday, Oct. 28, at 1 p.m. at the newly renovated Westchester County Park historic property at 140 Virginia Road in North White Plains.

The reopening follows a \$3.5 million capital project to restore this 18th century Rhode Island-style farmhouse house that was used as a Revolutionary War headquarters and command post by General George Washington during the Battle of White Plains.

The Miller House is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the New York State Register of Historic Places and the Westchester County Inventory of Historic Places. It is also a Town of North Castle Landmark.
