Re: Paradigm Treatment Centers LLC and 14-16 Cole Drive

Dear Honorable Supervisor Schiliro and Honorable Town Board Members:

As our lawyers, Cuddy & Feder, have pointed out in their January 6, 2017 letter, Paradigm had underhandedly (and unlawfully) launched a website in early 2016 aggressively marketing the proposed Cole Drive facility as a drug and alcohol treatment center. They surreptitiously pulled the plug on their website after we pointed this out and they blamed their 'webmaster' in an attempt to disclaim what their facility is truly intended to be.

Paradigm's facility is unquestionably a Drug and Substance Abuse program for teenagers and they have continued to market it as such on social media up until recently. "Teen Addiction Treatment" and "Drug Abuse Treatment" services are ubiquitous on Paradigm New York's Facebook and Twitter pages, as you will see below.

Up until this week, Paradigm's Facebook page described its services to include "Teen Addiction Treatment" (evidence below dated 1/8/17). Up through the end of December, Paradigm's Twitter page described its services as "Drug Abuse Treatment" and contains a multitude of tweets that pertain to drug abuse/addiction (evidence below dated 01/19/17).

Additionally, as some of you may have noted, an article appeared in the Journal News on Thursday, January 12, 2017. That article states that, "according to Paradigm" – that "out of 228 young people enrolled in Paradigm's program in California last year, 69 teens, or about 30 percent, came from New York state, including Lower Hudson Valley communities such as Bronxville, Chappaqua, Rye, Croton-on-Hudson, Scarsdale, Irvington, Eastchester, Mount Kisco, Mount Vernon, Chestnut Ridge, Montebello and Upper Nyack." But Paradigm's California facility is undeniably a substance abuse program (not even Paradigm denies that). The fact is that Paradigm wants and plans to treat these 69 teens and many other substance abusers at the Cole Drive facility for a substantial profit. It's claim that its New York clients will be treated only for "depression and anxiety" simply lacks credibility. It is also incapable of being policed.

We wanted to share this with you for the record. Since November 30, 2016 Paradigm has made a persistent claims that it will not admit customers with drug and substance abuse issues, yet it has continued to market 14-16 Cole Drive in this way on social media.

We urge the Town Board on January 25<sup>th</sup> to unanimously object and take every action available to the Town to enjoin Paradigm's unlawful misuse of the Padavan law and its threatened violation of the Town's zoning ordinance.





On their home page, they describe 2 services; Teen Mental Health Treatment and **Teen Addiction Treatment**.




And when you click on their Services Page, they list **Teen Addiction Treatment** as 1 of their 2 services...



As you will see from the following pages, Paradigm posted about drug abuse/addiction frequently in November 2016. Below are 10 of their tweets in November, which means that they were posting almost every third day about drug abuse/addiction.

Even after Paradigm filed their application with the Town in mid-November 2016, they continued to tweet about drug abuse and addiction. The tweet below is dated 11/29/16, the day before the first Town Board meeting when they declared that their Webmaster made a mistake.
