Minutes from December meeting were approved.

Programming Overlay of NCPL and Recreation

- Fran Davies job is to market programs for the library.
- o Chris is interested in compromising.
- o Courses at the library directly compete with recreation classes; too much overlap.
- o The Town Board needs to look into this.

Swimming Facility for Camp

- Ehrman Pool is not opening.
- Sue is in negotiations with Twin Oaks Pool in Chappaqua and has sent a proposal to the Twin Oaks Board.
- Sue is discussing with Frank and Betsy the possibility of adding another group to Chippewa.
 Instead of Grades 5-7, maybe add 8th grade and separate 5th & 6th and 7th & 8th.
- Maybe the older kids will go to Windmill Lake instead of swimming in a pool 3 days a week, a few hours at a time. It would be a different swimming experience with a beach, including volleyball and basketball courts. Sue to put specs together to have ready for February meeting of Windmill Executive Committee.

Valhalla Junior Vikings Request for Storage Unit

- Rents storage shed in the fall, along 3rd base line, Clove Road large field in NWP. They are asking
 if we would allow them to purchase instead of renting. Don suggested a nicer looking shed. We
 don't want wood for vandalism control, metal is best.
- Sue is ok with the purchase as long as it is pleasing and we make sure it is kept up and have an agreement that we are not responsible.

Credit Card Processing and Online Registration

- o John Cronin and Howard Arden are pushing for this, starting with the Recreation Department.
- o Initial installation quote from Vermont Systems is \$13,000; the annual will go up as well.
- Will look to get credit card processing anyway, even before approvals for online registration.

Request from ABL re: Waiving of Light Fees & Camp Revenue Sharing

- ABL sent Sue letter. ABL was surprised to be charged for lights. Any new billing cycle is flat \$2,100.
- ABL paid for lights this fall. They have a 2 year lease agreement to use Cox Avenue building. They
 don't pay rent because they did work on IBM 3. There is a 2 year written agreement with Town
 regarding Cox Ave.
- ABL knew they had to pay a year ago because they adjusted their schedule to not have night games.
- The light budget was cut \$8,000; \$30,000 from \$38,000.
- Sue must discuss this with ABL; PRB generally not in favor of not paying for lights.
- For programming, most contractors share an 80/20 split with Town. ABL does not want to share any profit. Sue and Bonnie can see some kind of break but not as it is written in the letter.
