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REGISTRATION AND IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Registration will be in the form of a lottery. The lottery enrollment period will run from Wednesday, March 6 through Tuesday, March 12. Lottery spins for class rosters will take place on Wednesday, March 13.

- ⇒ Online registration is available at <https://recreation.northcastleny.com>. The Activity Registration Form can be found [HERE](#).
- ⇒ In-person registration is available at the Hergenhan Community Center, 40 Maple Avenue in Armonk.
- ⇒ Visa, Mastercard and Amex credit cards are accepted - a 3% convenience fee will be charged for all credit and debit card transactions.
- ⇒ Persons participate at their own risk and should make certain they have their own insurance. The Town of North Castle does not provide medical insurance for participation in recreation programs.
- ⇒ Program fees will not be prorated, and program registrations are not transferable to another person.
- ⇒ A \$35 service charge will be assessed on all checks returned due to insufficient funds or for any other reason. Cash, money order, or certified check will be required to replace the returned check and service charge.

Town residents are those who live within the hamlets of Banksville, Armonk and North White Plains and pay taxes to the Town. The programs of North Castle Parks and Recreation are also made available to those residing within the Byram Hills School District, yet outside Town boundaries. In many cases, School District residents are required to pay a slightly higher “non-resident” fee than Town residents although they are given equal priority in the registration process. If there are still openings in programs after Town and School District residents have had an opportunity to register, the Department will consider non-resident applications at a higher fee and on a per program basis.

Register early! Registering at the last minute may mean that the program has already been filled, or that it has been cancelled due to insufficient enrollment.

REFUND POLICY


Refunds and/or credits will be given only under the following conditions:

- ⇒ All refund/credit requests, stating the reason for the refund/credit, must be made in writing prior to the halfway point of the program to the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation at recreation@northcastleny.com.
- ⇒ A full refund/credit will be given if the program is cancelled by the Parks and Recreation Department prior to the start of the program.
- ⇒ All requests for refunds made prior to the program start date, if granted, will be subject to a \$25 processing fee.
- ⇒ All requests for refunds made on or after the program start date, if granted, will be subject to a \$25 processing fee minus fees for any classes that have taken place.
- ⇒ No refund/credit will be considered once a program is half over.
- ⇒ If a participant becomes ill or injured for an extended period of time, a full or prorated refund/credit, **less a processing fee**, will be made based on the date the written refund request is received. A doctor's note must accompany the request, and the request must be made prior to the end of the program.

REGISTRATION AND IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Online Registration Checklist

Complete all of the below **BEFORE** the lottery enrollment period begins!

- ⇒ Make sure you have an established account. Do NOT create a “new” account if you have registered previously!
 - ⇒ Check that your username and password work.
 - ⇒ Check to see that all family member information listed on your account is correct and complete (age, gender, grade, birthdate, email, telephone numbers, etc.) as this will help ensure that your registrations are processed correctly; **this is important!!**

Weather Cancellations

In the case of a two hour delay at Byram Hills Schools, recreation programs scheduled to begin prior to 12 noon at the Hergenhan Community Center and other locations in Armonk will be cancelled.

In the case of a two hour delay at Valhalla Schools, recreation programs scheduled to begin prior to 12 noon at the North Castle Community Center in North White Plains will be cancelled.

If Byram Hills Schools are closed for the day, all programs throughout the day in Armonk will be cancelled.

If Valhalla Schools are closed for the day, all programs at the North Castle Community Center in North White Plains will be cancelled.

If any non-Town program or group has reserved a space at the Hergenhan Community Center or North Castle Community Center and the respective school districts are closed, then those scheduled meetings or functions will also be cancelled under the same terms as above. We will gladly work with you to reschedule your function at another mutually convenient time.

Activity Bus Information

Children in Grades 1 and above may ride the Activity Bus, which is made available by the Byram Hills Central School District, to after-school recreation programs in the Armonk area. Transportation to and from recreation programs is the responsibility of the participant or parent/guardian.

The Activity Bus form can be found [HERE](#) and must be returned to the Parks and Recreation Department prior to the start of any program - a separate form for each child, each program. DO NOT send any Activity Bus forms to the school or to transportation. The form may be dropped off to the Hergenhan Community Center at 40 Maple Avenue in Armonk, faxed to (914) 273-2139, or emailed to recreation@northcastleny.com.

Any issues or concerns that arise from Activity Bus use should be addressed with the Byram Hills Central School District Transportation Department by calling (914) 273-4245.

PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITY RENTAL INFORMATION

Park facilities are available to Town residents and local businesses for recreational purposes only. Certain facilities such as a picnic pavilion, ball field, or gazebo may be reserved by a particular group for a fee. Groups with less than 60% residents pay a non-resident rate. Any organization or individual looking to use park property for the purpose of conducting business must contact the Parks and Recreation Superintendent for special permission and arrangements.

The use of the Hergenhan Community Center and North Castle Community Center is open to any group, organization, and business located within the Town. Groups comprised of fewer than 60% residents will pay a non-resident rate. The Hergenhan Community Center and North Castle Community Center may not be used for any commercial purposes, religious functions, or private fundraising events. Activities conducted by the Town or by any other organization whose proposed activities are consistent with the Town's mission and provide benefits to residents of the Town of North Castle are allowed.

Any organization or individual looking to use a recreation facility for commercial purposes must contact the Parks and Recreation Superintendent for special permission and arrangements. The Parks and Recreation Department reserves the right to co-sponsor profitable events with a portion of the proceeds going to the Town.

Specific reservation forms, listing reservation fees, rules, policies, and insurance requirements can be found [HERE](#) and on the Town website. You can also pick up a reservation form at our office or call us and we will email you a form. Please contact Superintendent Matt Trainor with questions at mtrainor@northcastleny.com.

In all cases of desiring to reserve a park or recreation facility, reservations will not be held until payment is received and application form is complete. In many cases, a damage deposit will be required. In some cases, a certificate of liability insurance listing the Town of North Castle as additionally insured will be required as well. The only groups exempt from a rental fee are Town Departments, Boards and Committees, and groups co-sponsored by the Parks and Recreation Department.

TOWN CAMP INFORMATION

How Do I Register My Child For Camp?: Registering for camp is a two-step process.

First, submit together both the completed [camp registration form](#) and [child's immunization record](#) to the recreation office and allow a day or two for the documents to be reviewed and accepted. There will be **NO** notification from our office as to whether your camp documents have been accepted or denied. It is your responsibility to follow up.

The completed camp registration form and immunization record can be submitted in several ways, either...

- **In Person** at the Hergenhan Community Center, 40 Maple Avenue, Armonk, NY 10504
- **Document Upload** through your online registration account
- **Fax** to (914) 273-2139
- **Email** to recreation@northcastleny.com
- **USPS Mail** to North Castle Recreation, 40 Maple Avenue, Armonk, NY 10504

Second, choose the session(s) and make payment through your online registration account or in person. Cash, check, and credit card accepted - Visa, Mastercard, Amex. A 3% convenience fee will be charged for all credit and debit card transactions.

Day Camp Refund Policy: Refund requests received by May 31 will be issued for 90% of the relevant fee. Refund requests received between June 1 and prior to the first day of camp will be issued for 50% of the fee. There will be **NO** refunds given for requests received on or after July 1. A \$25 processing fee will be assessed for all approved refunds.

Day Camp Financial Aid Policy: It is the intention of the Town of North Castle to assist its residents in participating in summer day camp recreation programs by offering financial aid to those who truly need it. Residents can obtain a financial aid application form from the Recreation Office and must follow the procedures below. All of your information will be kept confidential.

Eligibility:

- Applicant must be a full-time resident of the Town of North Castle.
- Applicant must provide all of the required information outlined on the financial aid application.
- Financial aid applications will be accepted for Camp Kick-A-Poo and Camp Chippewa ONLY.

When Applying:

- Camp registration form and immunization record must accompany the financial aid application.
- Application must be received no later than May 31 of the year applying - this includes your tax and financial documentation, as well as a valid photo ID and two of the following - recent tax bill, recent utility bill, recent bank statement, recent mortgage bill or statement. We require this time to review your information and make a determination.
- A twenty percent (20%) payment of the total fee, rounded up to the nearest whole dollar amount, is required.
- All fees determined to be due must be paid in full to the Recreation Department office prior to the start of the camp program. Your child will not be enrolled until **FULL** payment is received.

CAMP KICK-A-POO 3-5 YEAR OLDS

Camp Kick-A-Poo - July 1 through August 9 (no camp 7/4) is a preschool camp for children entering Kindergarten in 2024, 2025, and 2026 (children must turn 3 by or on December 1, 2024) and who must be toilet trained.

Camp Kick-A-Poo, which is held at H.C. Crittenden Middle School, runs for six weeks from 9AM to 1PM. Campers enjoy lots of activities, including music, arts & crafts, creative movement, water play, and outdoor games. Camp hosts special events and entertainers throughout the summer. Emphasis is placed on socialization and learning new skills.

Weather permitting, children swim twice per week. There is a camp medical specialist on staff and the directors, as well as others, are trained in emergency response. If your child may require medication during the day, a [medication authorization form](#) must be submitted to the camp medical specialist on the first day of camp, along with the medication placed in a labelled Ziploc bag - this includes epi pens and inhalers!

There is no transportation for Camp Kick-A-Poo - parents must drop off and pick up their children. Campers are required to bring their own non-perishable lunch. It is recommended that a cold pack be included in a knapsack or lunch box so that food doesn't spoil. Perishable items should be avoided.

A Parent Handbook will be available in mid-June which will provide more detailed information.

CAMP CHIPPEWA FINISHING GRADES K-8

Camp Chippewa - July 1 through August 9 (no camp 7/4) provides fun and enrichment for children offering a variety of activities, games, events, and action for campers. Daily bus transportation is included for most areas of town. A bus route schedule will be available in mid-June.

Camp Chippewa, which is held at Wampus School, runs for six weeks from 9AM to 3PM. Weather permitting, children swim 2 to 3 times per week. Campers are grouped by grade and assigned to the corresponding age-appropriate activities. There are a variety of Friday special events, trips, cooking, sports, art, and outdoor games. At Chippewa we believe our activities are an important part of the development of our campers' social, creative, and athletic skills. Working and playing together encourages campers to experience a new and exciting adventure each and every day.

There is a camp medical specialist on staff, and the directors, trip directors, lifeguards, and others are trained in emergency response. If your child may require medication during the day, a [medication authorization form](#) must be submitted to the camp medical specialist on the first day of camp, along with the medication placed in a labelled Ziploc bag - this includes epi pens and inhalers!

How Do I Get A Pool Pass?

Pool Permit Application can be found [HERE](#). Pool passes can be purchased at the Hergenhan Community Center, 40 Maple Avenue in Armonk weekdays from 8:30AM to 4:30PM. Summer hours after Memorial Day are weekdays from 8AM to 4PM. Early bird rates expire Saturday 6/1 at 1PM. Pool permit applications and photos will not be accepted or taken at the pool. The Hergenhan Community Center will have extended office hours for pool passes and photos from 9AM to 1PM on Saturday 5/25 and Saturday 6/1.

Two (2) proofs of residency (a photo ID and a current dated bill, such as a tax bill, utility bill, mortgage statement) are required each year whether you are a new or returning pass holder. Renters must show rental agreement as proof of residency. The burden of proof of residency rests with the person submitting the application. An auto insurance ID card is **NOT** an acceptable proof of residency.

All applicants must have a current photo on file for their pool ID card. Please note that new pictures should be taken for preschool and grammar school-aged children. Photos are taken at the Hergenhan Community Center. No admittance will be allowed into the pool without a current pool pass ID card. No refunds will be given for pool passes. Lost pool ID cards can be replaced for a \$5 fee.

Private Swim Lessons

Group lessons (*see Page 40*) are not for everyone - don't give up! Try a private or semi-private lesson. Lessons are available - ***must be a pool pass holder*** - for all ages and abilities. For more information, please contact the Pool Director during open season at (914) 273-3275. All requests will be taken at the pool. Private lessons will **NOT** be booked prior to opening day.

⇒ **Private lessons** are 30 minutes with a 1:1 student-to-instructor ratio.

⇒ \$55 per lesson

⇒ \$250 for a five (5) pack of 30 minute lessons

⇒ **Semi-private lessons** are 30 minutes with a 2:1 student-to-instructor ratio.

⇒ Students must be similar in skill level and age range.

⇒ \$70 per lesson

⇒ \$318 for a five (5) pack of 30 minute lessons

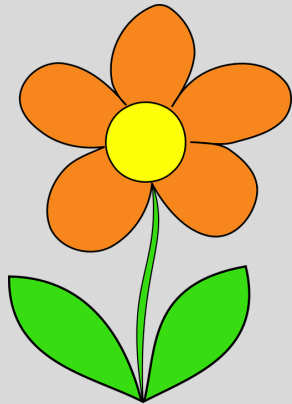
