The Committee determined that Planning Board and Architectural Review Board approval of the proposed project is NOT REQUIRED.				
However, the following issues will need to be addressed prior to the issuance of a building permit:				
 The Applicant shall submit a gross floor area calculations worksheet and backup data. The worksheet should include all new partially enclosed deck floor area to the satisfaction of the Building Department. Based upon the submitted site plan, the lots is made up of multiple tax lots. The tax lots should be merged into one tax/building lot at this time via the Town Assessor's office. The plan shall illustrate and quantify the limits of disturbance to the satisfaction of the Town Engineer. The plan shall note that disturbance limits shall be staked in the field prior to construction. Include erosion control measures on the plan, including, but not limited to, temporary construction access, silt fence, tree protection, construction sequence, etc. to the satisfaction of the Town Engineer. Provide details.
