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REGISTRATION AND IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Registration for the lottery will open on Tuesday 12/2 at 10:00AM and will close on Tuesday 12/9 at 11:59PM. Lottery spins for class rosters will take place on Wednesday 12/10. Enrollment offers must be accepted and payment must be made by noon on Friday 12/12 to secure roster spots for these enrollment offers.

- ⇒ Online registration is available at <https://recreation.northcastleny.com>. In-person registration is available at the Hergenhan Community Center, 40 Maple Avenue in Armonk.
- ⇒ Visa, Mastercard and Amex credit cards are accepted - a 3% convenience fee will be charged for all credit and debit card transactions.
- ⇒ Persons participate at their own risk and should make certain they have their own insurance. The Town of North Castle does not provide medical insurance for participation in recreation programs.
- ⇒ Program fees will not be prorated for late program participants. Program registrations are not transferable to another person.
- ⇒ A \$20 service charge will be assessed on all checks returned due to insufficient funds or for any other reasons.

Town residents are those who live within the hamlets of Banksville, Armonk and North White Plains and pay taxes to the Town. The programs of North Castle Parks and Recreation are also made available to those residing within the Byram Hills School District, yet outside Town boundaries. In many cases, School District residents are required to pay a slightly higher "non-resident" fee than Town residents although they are given equal priority in the registration process. If there are still openings in programs after Town and School District residents have had an opportunity to register, the Department will consider non-resident applications at a higher fee and on a per program basis.

Register early! Registering at the last minute may mean that the program has already been filled, or that it has been cancelled due to insufficient enrollment.

REFUND POLICY

Refunds and/or credits will be given only under the following conditions:

- ⇒ All refund/credit requests, stating the reason for the refund/credit, must be made in writing prior to the halfway point of the program to the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation at recreation@northcastleny.com.
- ⇒ A full refund/credit will be given if the program is cancelled by the Parks and Recreation Department prior to the start of the program.
- ⇒ All requests for refunds made prior to the program start date, if granted, will be subject to a \$25 processing fee.
- ⇒ All requests for refunds made on or after the program start date, if granted, will be subject to a \$25 processing fee minus fees for any classes that have taken place.
- ⇒ No refund/credit will be considered once a program is half over.
- ⇒ If a participant becomes ill or injured for an extended period of time, a full or prorated refund/credit, less a processing fee, will be made based on the date the written refund request is received. A doctor's note must accompany the request, and the request must be made prior to the end of the program.

REGISTRATION AND IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Online Registration Checklist

Complete all of the below **BEFORE** the lottery enrollment period begins!

- ⇒ Make sure you have an established account. Do NOT create a “new” account if you have registered previously!
- ⇒ Check that your username and password work.
- ⇒ Check to see that all family member information listed on your account is correct and complete (age, gender, grade, birthdate, email, telephone numbers, etc.) as this will help ensure that your registrations are processed correctly; **this is important!!**

Weather Cancellations

In the case of a two hour delay at Byram Hills Schools, recreation programs scheduled to begin prior to 12 noon at the Hergenhan Community Center and other locations in Armonk will be cancelled.

In the case of a two hour delay at Valhalla Schools, recreation programs scheduled to begin prior to 12 noon at the North Castle Community Center in North White Plains will be cancelled.

If Byram Hills Schools are closed for the day, all programs throughout the day in Armonk will be cancelled.

If Valhalla Schools are closed for the day, all programs at the North Castle Community Center in North White Plains will be cancelled.

If any non-Town program or group has reserved a space at the Hergenhan Community Center or North Castle Community Center and the respective school districts are closed, then those scheduled meetings or functions will also be cancelled under the same terms as above. We will gladly work with you to reschedule your function at another mutually convenient time or refund your fee completely.

Activity Bus Information

Children in Grades 1 and above may ride the Activity Bus, which is made available by the Byram Hills Central School District, to after-school recreation programs in the Armonk area. Transportation to and from recreation programs is the responsibility of the participant or parent or guardian. North Castle Parks and Recreation does not operate the Activity Bus. Any issues or concerns that arise from Activity Bus use should be addressed with the Transportation Department by calling (914) 273-4245.

Registering for the Activity Bus is done through the online registration website at <https://recreation.northcastleny.com> by searching for Activity Bus or Program #222293, selecting the school and day of the week, and following the prompts. This is for North Castle Parks and Recreation Department programs ONLY! If your child is taking a class or an activity on any given day through any other organization, you must still register through that organization utilizing the Activity Bus Form with that vendor. There are NO EXCEPTIONS to this! Call the Parks and Recreation Department at (914) 273-3000 x49 with questions or issues with trying to register.

PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITY RENTAL INFORMATION

Park facilities are available to Town residents and local businesses for recreational purposes only. Certain facilities such as a picnic pavilion, ball field, or gazebo may be reserved by a particular group for a fee. Groups comprised of fewer than 60% residents will pay a non-resident rate. Any organization or individual looking to use park property for the purpose of conducting business must contact the Parks and Recreation Superintendent for special permission and arrangements.

The use of the Hergenhan Community Center and North Castle Community Center is open to any group, organization, and business located within the Town. Groups comprised of fewer than 60% residents will pay a non-resident rate. The Hergenhan Community Center and North Castle Community Center may not be used for any commercial purposes, religious functions, or private fundraising events. Activities conducted by the Town or by any other organization whose proposed activities are consistent with the Town's mission and provide benefits to residents of the Town of North Castle are allowed.

Any organization or individual looking to use a recreation facility for commercial purposes must contact the Parks and Recreation Superintendent for special permission and arrangements. The Parks and Recreation Department reserves the right to co-sponsor profitable events with a portion of the proceeds going to the Town.

Specific reservation forms, listing reservation fees, rules, policies, and insurance requirements, can be found on the Town website. You can also pick up a reservation form at our office or call us and we will email you a form. Please contact Superintendent Matt Trainor with questions at mtrainor@northcastleny.com.

In all cases of desiring to reserve a park or recreation facility, reservations will not be held until payment is received and application form is complete. In many cases, a damage deposit will be required. In some cases, a certificate of liability insurance listing the Town of North Castle as additionally insured will be required as well. The only groups exempt from a rental fee are Town Departments, Boards and Committees, and groups co-sponsored by the Parks and Recreation Department.






